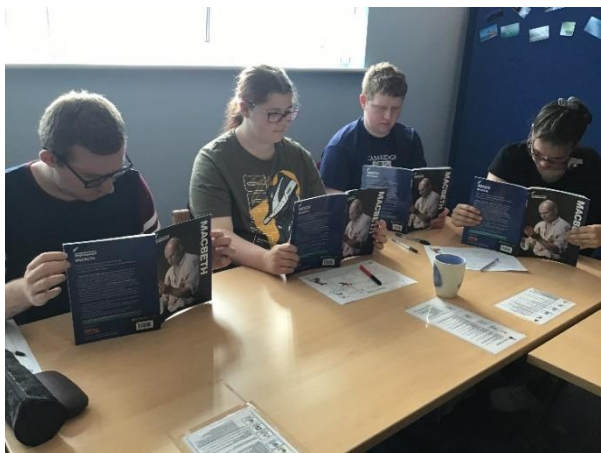


The group also had the chance to dress up as firefighters and the police!
