National Immunisation Programme

In line with the National Immunisation Programme, the Community School Aged Immunisation Service offers Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio and Meningococcal ACWY vaccinations to all pupils in Year 9. It also will be offered to anyone who missed the vaccinations in year 10 and above.
