

Keeping safe This Halloween

With half term fast approaching Cambridgeshire Constabulary asked us to share the following information with our students and parents:

Dark evenings leave some people wary of opening the door to strangers. If you see a 'no trick or treat' sign please respect it.

Make sure your Halloween pranks do not cause offence or worse, break the law!

If anyone sees behaviour that they think is unacceptable it should be reported to police on 101.
