Travel to Lourdes with HCPT Group 104



The Hosanna House and Children's Pilgrimage Trust (HCPT) take thousands of children with additional needs on a pilgrimage holiday. We are a Catholic organisation who want everyone to be able to experience the beauty of Lourdes, but we want them to do it surrounded by friends, making memories, singing songs and having the holiday of a lifetime.

Group 104 are the Cambridge Group. We travel to Lourdes each Easter. In 2023, the trip runs from 9th-15th April.

We are recruiting helpers!

This means getting involved with fundraising, attending training and coming along for our fun-filled week in Lourdes. You will meet and look after some very special young people and help us give them an unforgettable week!

What will I be doing?

Helpers work with the whole group to ensure all the children are kept safe and happy throughout the week in Lourdes. Specific tasks depend on the childrens' needs, but you will never be left alone and we will discuss any training or mentoring you might need beforehand. You will also have the opportunity to explore and experience Lourdes by yourself, on breaks or in the evenings on a rota.

How could it help me?

HCPT is a registered, large multi-national charity. If you are looking to strengthen your CV, or are considering a career in children's services, nursing, medicine or any other 'people-focussed' pathway, this opportunity could help you get there. Equally, if you are looking for somewhere new to bring your existing skills, please get in touch!

Is it right for me?

People travel to Lourdes for all sorts of personal reasons. You *do not* to be Catholic to travel with us, just open-minded and willing to get stuck in. Lourdes is a beautiful town and travelling with HCPT has something for everyone. With Group 104, you will make friends and memories to last a lifetime, whilst learning about yourself in a fun, inclusive and truly unique way.

What does an average day look like?

Every day is different, but we can guarantee you will be busy. Each day is filled with activities, such as trips to the zoo, paddling on the beach, snowball fights in the Pyrénées mountains, donkey rides, water fights, and of course visits to the beautiful Grotto in Lourdes. We also celebrate an inclusive mass on most days and learn about the story of Lourdes together. Evening activities include crafts, music and of course, the famous Torchlight Procession. Days are planned carefully to ensure everyone gets a break and can experience Lourdes fully. Helpers are sociable beings, and we love a good chat after a busy day with the children.

What do I need to do?

The volunteering committment is low: we require you to be in Cambridge for 3-4 weekend days throughout the year for mandatory training and to meet the child you will be working with.

There is also a fare to be paid by helpers, but as a group we have access to grants and financial support - the earlier we know you need it, the better. Fares are likely to be around £700, inclusive of flights, full-board accomodation and all excursions for the week. Please do not be put off by fares - we want you to come, and we need helpers! You can also fundraise for your own fares and we will support you with this.
