This half term Foxes enjoyed taking part in lots of exciting Art activities.

Students learnt about Chinese New Year and made a Chinese dragon with symmetrical printing technique and decorated the dragons with colourful shiny ribbons. They looked magnificent!

We learnt about the book, 'Mrs Wishy Washy's Farm' and we made the characters from the story. We experimented with shaving foam and brown paint, and made squashy muddy pig pictures. Students used communication aids to indicate what colour feathers they wanted their duck to be.

During Wonder Week, we had the best time making confetti fireworks in the Parachute game session and decorated the 'sound of the week' in Phonics. We enjoyed an Art Bucket session with Yuki, watching her making mono printing and motion painting, which was very exciting.

We also had a couple of fun filled music sessions with Sam and Anthony. With Sam, we used different instruments and "we made some noise" enjoying playing on the guitar and the keyboard. Anthony helped us to drum, and we loved dancing/rocking to the music!


