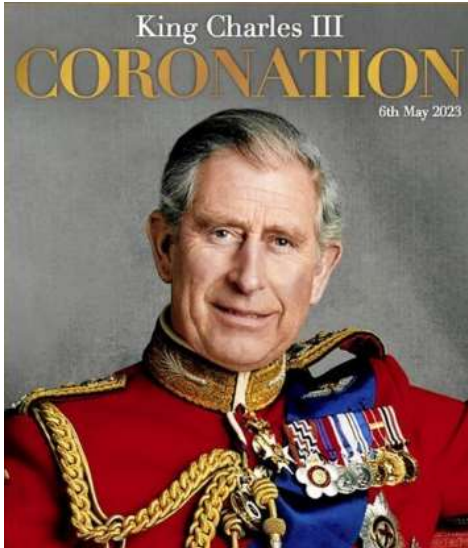




This Saturday 6th May 2023 at Westminster Abbey in London, the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III will take place.

Hedgehogs Class News

Hedgehog Class have had a good start to the summer term. We have been enjoying reading *The Gruffalo* and looking at the rhyming words, setting and characters in the story. We have been making our own forest and Gruffalo pictures and a wanted poster for the Gruffalo. We looked for the Gruffalo in forest school and will be making our own Gruffalo Crumble!





In the story baby bear goes on a journey into space, so in our art session we have been working on creating our own planets. First, we tried mixing paint and shaving foam in plastic bags to create planets with interesting colours and textures. In our next lesson we used papier mâché and balloon to create 3D planets which we will paint next week.



Edinburgh Class News

In Edinburgh class this term we are reading "Whatever Next" by Jill Murphy. During our sensory story sessions we have been working on anticipating what is coming next and using recordable buttons to join in with familiar parts of the story.



We have also been exploring the concept of light and dark using light boxes in our quiet room and during explore room sessions. These lessons are a lovely sensory experience for the children but also help us to teach contingency awareness, how our actions have an effect on the world around us. It has been great to see some of children being so intentional in the way they control the lights and explore the light boxes.
