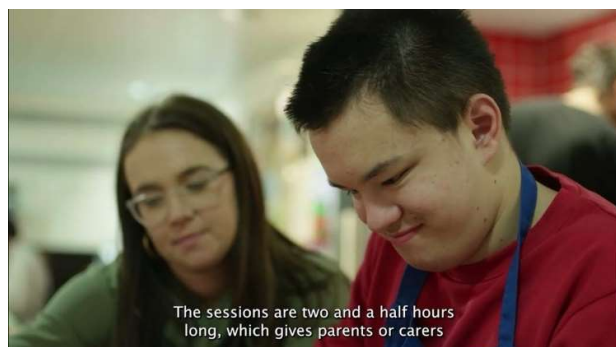
Bees News
